Theme, Format, and Participants

Immunohistochemistry and Immunofluorescence (IHCIF): A Histochemical Society Hands-on Training Course is a 4.5-day laboratory short course. It is ideal for experimental and translational research scientists, diagnosticians, and technical staff who are new to immunohistochemistry and immunofluorescence or those with experience who aim to take their skills to the next level. Faculty to student ratios are low (1:3 or better) to maximize participants' experience at the course and foster networking opportunities during and beyond the course.
